

OBTAINING A FENCE PERMIT

Reference Chapter 635-80 Article X - Accessory Uses and Structures – Fences

PERMIT REQUIRED: A fence permit is required to be obtained from the Building Inspector and fees paid prior to installation of any fence.

FEE: \$140 (\$65 permit fee, \$25 admin fee, \$50 plan review fee)

RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT - FENCE REGULATIONS

HEIGHT

- 1. Height of fence not to exceed 6'
- 2. Height of fence in front yard not to exceed 3'
- 3. Height of fence adjacent to non-residential zone not to exceed 8'
- 4. Height of fence within 25 feet of intersection of any street not to exceed 3'

SETBACK - 3' setback from lot line. It is the responsibility of the property owner to ensure the fence is located on his/her property.

SECURITY FENCES – Not allowed in residential districts

PROHIBITED FENCES

- 1. Dangerous fences
- 2. Electric fences
- 3. Barbed wire fences

COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT FENCE REGULATIONS

HEIGHT not to exceed 8'

SECURITY FENCES not to exceed 10' (open type similar to woven wire/wrought iron)

PROHIBITED FENCES

- 1. Electric fences are not allowed
- 2. Barbed wire fences ARE allowed in Industrial Districts if devices to secure the barbed wire to the fence are 10' above ground.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1. Fences should be maintained in good condition and the decorative/finished side of the fence shall face the adjoining property.
- 2. Temporary fences for construction projects shall be clearly marked. Permit is not required. Temporary fences shall be removed within 45 days.
- 3. Non-conforming fence. Any fence that is non-conforming to the regulations listed above shall be brought into conformance if more than 50% of the fence is altered, modified or improved.
